For this summer assignment, you must read closely and react thoughtfully to two novels. Read one novel between the end of this school year and Friday, July 30th. Read the second novel between July 31st and Friday, August 27th. We will close the blog at the end of each period and will accept no entries after this point. Technical Requirements: For the summer assignment in Honors English 12, you will need to use your Bonny Eagle gmail account. **You will need to be logged into your Bonny Eagle email to post on the blog.**

Required Responses: For your responses, you are required to post **FOUR** blog entries over the course of the summer, **two entries for each of the two books**.

Once here, you will see a link to each of the four specific posts (*Honors English 12 Summer Reading Post #1/1st Entry for 1st Book*, for example). After you write your entry, <u>post as anonymous but place your first name and last initial at the end of your write-up so that we know who has posted.</u>

Each entry should begin with the date of your entry and an **important quotation** from the section of the text that you read. While part of each entry should summarize what you have read, the majority of the entry should be your reaction to and analysis of this section of the text. Each entry should be about 200 words. We are looking for your thoughtful engagement with the text. Post your first entry when you have read about half of the book. Post your second entry when you've completed the book.

By the end of the summer, <u>you will have posted a total of four entries</u>, two entries for each book. The blog entries will count as your first summative assessment. We will not accept late work for this assignment.

Second Assessment: You will also be assessed on the summer reading upon your return, shortly after the school year begins. This assessment will be modeled on a past Open Essay question from the AP English Literature exam. Below is one such question from a past AP English Literature Exam:

It has often been said that what we value can be determined only by what we sacrifice. Consider how this statement applies to a character from a novel or play. Select a character that has deliberately sacrificed, surrendered, or forfeited something in a way that highlights that

character's values. Then write a well-organized essay in which you analyze how the particular sacrifice illuminates the character's values and provides a deeper understanding of the meaning of the work as a whole.

<u>Due dates:</u> All blog entries for the first book are due by the end of the day on **Friday**, **July 30th**. All of the entries for the second book are due by the end of the day on **Friday**, **August 27th**. **We will close the blogs at the end of each period**.
